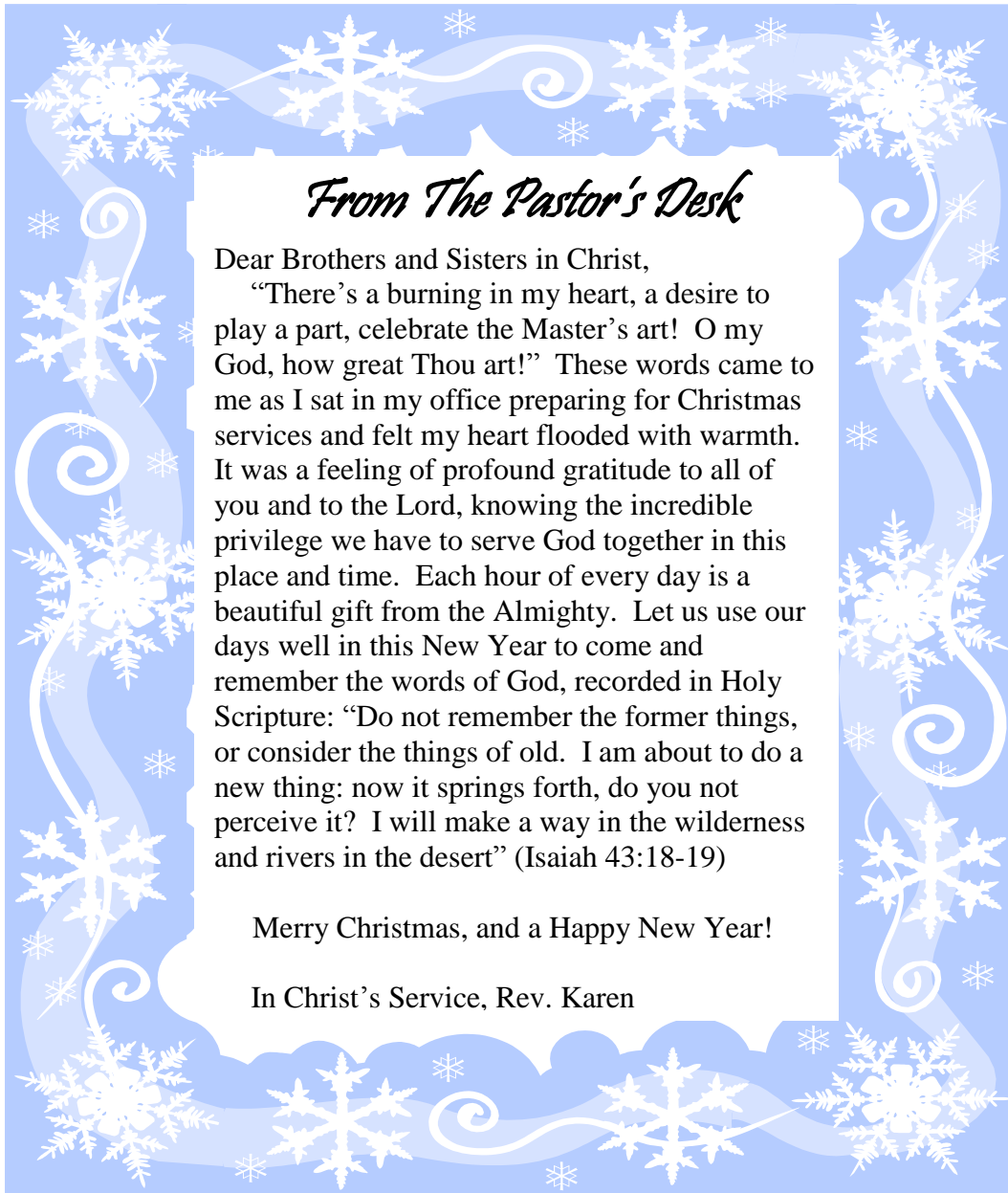

Judy Danner: On September 11 of this year, many of you were involved in the "Day of Service." Unbeknownst to us, Judy Danner was standing beside us as we were on the front steps, getting our picture taken. Judy felt the warmth and fellowship from our group, and became interested in Drew. She has been an active participant, and now Judy has become a member of our congregation.

Judy was born & raised in Carroll Co., Iowa. Her parents were a farmer & school teacher. Judy is one of several siblings- unfortunately her sister in Kansas suffers from Alzheimer's. Her brother is also hearing impaired. After Judy graduated from high school, she graduated from cosmetology school and worked. Judy was married and has two lovely children, both living in Putnam County: Danny and DeeAnn. DeeAnn and her husband have three awesome children.

Judy recently retired after working twenty-two years at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Iowa City, IA, in 2006. She became active in church bazaars, helped start a Self-Help for the Hard of Hearing chapter in Iowa City, and started a Friends of the Deaf social club in Iowa City for the deaf. She was a 4-H leader with two clubs, and was a public speaker. Judy was also active with the Johnson County Committee for the Disabled, and traveled throughout Iowa and got involved with the deaf culture to prepare herself if she became deaf.

Judy and her second husband lived in Brewster two years ago and then returned to Iowa. A year ago, she had to "let go and let God" help her leave her families and best friends, and returned to Putnam County. Judy said, "I am deaf without the hearing aids, hearing with the hearing aids, but I know the Lord will accept me which ever I am."

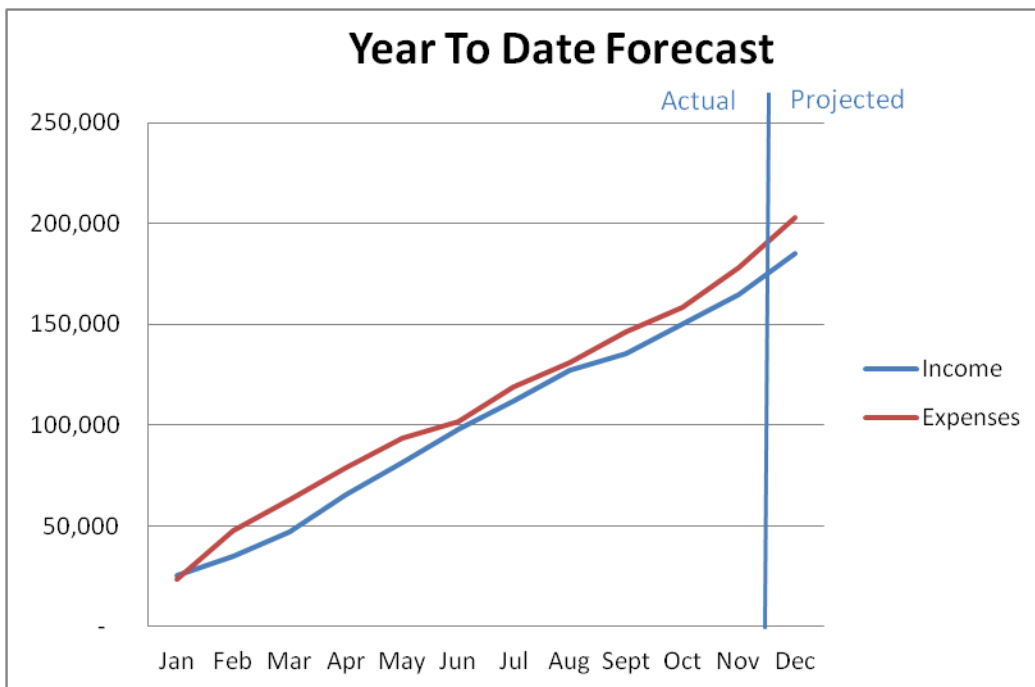
