## Lay Leader Report

Reverend Karen and I have met and spoken on several occasions since the beginning of the year discussing ideas and uniting prayerfully for direction. We hope to have biweekly if not weekly meetings to share and pray for the people of Drew UMC. While confidentiality is paramount, Rev. Karen and I do share the names and needs of members of the congregation in order for us to better follow up with each member. It is my hope to send notes and cards to members during times of illness and need of comfort or assistance that is personalized. This effort is yet to be implemented. While I plan to continue to lead by invitation and example, I do want to focus attention on two additional areas.

A bulletin board that will serve as an information center of opportunities available within our NY/CT District and the NY Annual Conference is to be mounted on the wall opposite the stairway to Rev Karen's office. I plan to organize or recruit folks interested in serving and learning within our connectional ministry, NY Annual Conference. Not only do I want to enlighten our membership with what the District and Conference offer, I plan to encourage and provide assistance in arranging for our congregants to attend and participate in our connectional ministries. If possible and when necessary, we shall try to find scholarships for congregants should money be the stumbling block. In other words, I will lead, escort or whatever is necessary to assist our congregation in utilizing the opportunities afforded by our District and Conference.

Secondly, I intend to begin and encourage other leaders in our church to begin mentoring each other in their gifts, talents and spiritual journey. While some may see this as interfering, I assure you I will merely make suggestions and lead by example. Mentoring is a part of the congregation's fabric that we can strengthen utilizing this method. Henry McCarter strongly supports this and encouraged all in training at Jesse Lee to use this tool where ever possible.

Currently, I serve as a member of the Natural Church Development Health Team chaired by Jim MacDonald. Along with Bill Listwan, I work to provide a weekly laity led Saturday Evening Worship Service which is an alternate service as opposed to an alternative or contemporary service. We are making attempts to bring others from our conference to our church to share their testimonies and teach, lead us in worship with their gifts and experience. Recently, Nikki Edelman from Poughquag UMC shared her experience in Haiti last summer as part of VIM/ERT, joining us in a pot luck feast and leading worship one Saturday evening.

Bill and I are organizing a Lenten Group Study and small meal followed by worship together during the Lenten Season. Then during the same time I will be teaching an Advanced Spiritual Gifts workshop at the Grace UMC in Newburgh as part of their Lenten School. There will be other classes offered, Bible studies and Lay Speaker Training during this Lenten School. I am currently also beginning the studies while awaiting my assigned mentor by DCOM.

Lastly, I organized and attended with other members of our congregation the annual leadership training workshop held at Jesse Lee Memorial UMC in Ridgefield, CT. The workshops that were attended by our Committee Chairs were SPRC, Finance, Trustees, Missions, Education and Lay Leadership. Drew UMC was well represented, and I am pleased to be a part of a leadership team open to suggestions or skills to employ in leading our committee charges. Willingness to learn is an excellent example of humility. Henry McCarter led my workshop on Lay Leadership and defined areas of responsibility according to the "Book of Discipline". He basically illustrated the responsibility of a lay leader as the emotional and spiritual liaison between the Pastor and the congregation, whereas the role of SPR and the SPR liaison is more contractual and administrative. I also learned it is my responsibility to see a need and either initiate, oversee, or personally fulfill the necessities required.
